

Kogila Moodley is Professor of Sociology in Educational Studies, in the faculty of Education and was the first holder of the David Lam Chair in Multicultural Education. She has co-authored with Heribert Adam: South Africa Without Apartheid, 1987; The Opening of the Apartheid Mind, 1993, Comrades in Business: Post Liberation Politics in South Africa 1997, and Seeking Mandela. Peacemaking Between Israelis and Palestinians. (2005). She has edited Beyond Multicultural Education, published seventy articles, chapters in books and research reports. She was past President of the International Sociological Association's Research Committee on Ethnic, Minority and Race Relations (1998-2001) and serves on the editorial board of Ethnic and Racial Studies (London). She has been a Research Associate at the Centre for African Studies at the University of Cape Town, and currently serves as Director of Research and Development at the Desmond Tutu Peace Centre in Cape Town, South Africa.
